OTF Grant helps NROCRC recover from the impacts of COVID-19

Ottawa, Ontario – On Wednesday November 3rd, 2021, the Nepean, Rideau, and Osgoode Community Resource Centre, (NROCRC) formally acknowledged their \$68,900 Resilient Communities Fund grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, (OTF) at their virtual Annual General Meeting. The Honourable Lisa MacLeod, Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries and MPP for Nepean, Jeremy Roberts, MPP Ottawa West—Nepean and Katharine Bambrick, Chief Executive Officer, Ontario Trillium Foundation were present for the occasion and congratulated NROCRC's staff and board members.

This Resilient Communities Fund grant will help NROCRC hire a staff person, engage experts for strategic planning and research and evaluation, purchase office supplies and cover employment-related expenses to rebuild and recover from the impacts of COVID-19. The pandemic had a significant effect on NROCRC's programming and its ability to deliver services to the communities it serves. The OTF's grant will allow NROCRC to develop their next Strategic Plan and related initiatives to prepare for upcoming priorities and to build resiliency in the years to come.

"Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, our government has committed to supporting those struggling the most," said Lisa MacLeod, Minister of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries and MPP for Nepean. By providing the necessary resources to develop our next Strategic Plan and related evaluation and fundraising mechanisms, this grant will ensure that we can deliver critical supports to address priority community needs with the greatest impact.
